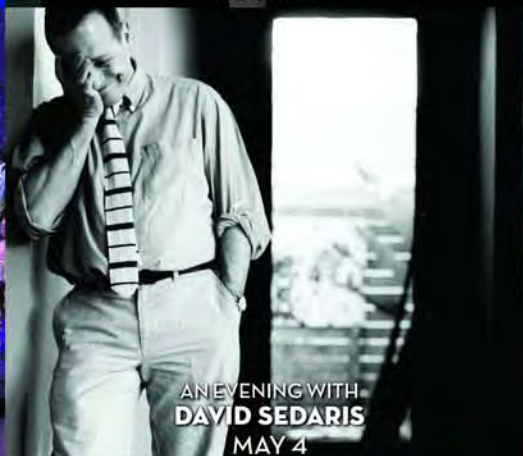
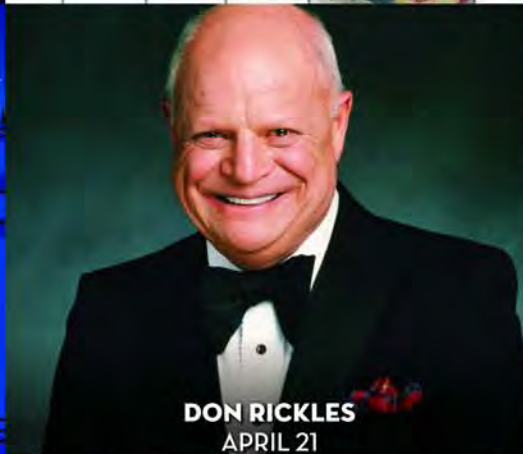

A Message from the General Manager

African American History Month

Documentaries are a powerful form of storytelling on television that illuminate our present and chronicle our past. PBS is strongly committed to this art form. Ken Burns is considered a master and so are the documentaries on **American Experience** and **FRONTLINE**, or those by independent producers on **Independent Lens** and **POV**. For nearly 50 years, Vegas PBS has also produced more than 100 long-form documentaries to tell the story of Southern Nevada and create a shared sense of place for all those who live here.

This month we premiere, **African Americans: The Las Vegas Experience**, highlighting the momentous events that defined Las Vegas throughout the civil rights era. In trying to tell this story, we found that there is not "a" history but many histories that represent this period in Southern Nevada. Called by some "the Mississippi of the West" during the civil rights era, Nevada has a surprising history of discrimination and official segregation, civil protest, court cases, and eventual reform. In **African Americans: The Las Vegas Experience**, viewers will hear this story from the perspective of the leaders of many civil rights initiatives.

This production was made possible through a remarkable partnership with the UNLV Libraries Special Collections and the Community Partners of the African American Collaborative. We are pleased we can provide a narrative introduction to the richness of their document collections and their oral history archives. Funding was provided by grants from the U.S. Institute of Museum and Library Services and the Commission for The Las Vegas Centennial. Additionally, Boyd Gaming granted us use of their hotel facilities to recreate pivotal scenes from our civil rights history.

This documentary is one of several programs scheduled throughout the month on Vegas PBS to honor the lives, struggles and accomplishments of African Americans. See pages 12-13 for more information on Black History Month programming.

This program is the latest in our renewed emphasis on local storytelling. Recent projects include **Makers: Women in Nevada History**, **The Test**, **Restoration Neon**, **Broadway in the Hood**, and **Our Chest of Dreams**. These programs seek to fulfill our mission to "use television and other technologies to amplify and extend" the mission of community partners. Combined, these partnerships create a growing collection of documentaries that help create a more complete understanding of the unique community of Southern Nevada.

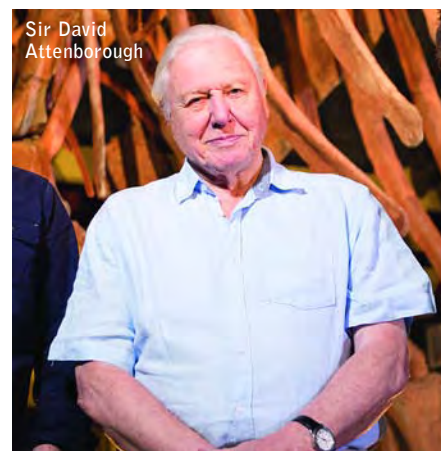

In the late 1800s, Boston reigned as America's most crowded city, with nearly 400,000 people packed into a downtown of less than one square mile. With more than 8,000 horses pulling the trolleys, the city was filthy, noisy, reeking of manure and packed with humanity. The time had come to replace horse-drawn trolleys with a faster, cleaner, safer and more efficient form of transportation. A young American inventor named Frank Sprague had a revolutionary idea; however, he had to overcome a litany of engineering challenges, the greed-driven interests of businessmen and the great fears of its citizenry to construct America's first subway.

Filthy Cities

Do you have to dodge the contents of bedpans or step over rotting corpses on your way to work? Dan Snow's series brings to life the murky histories of three great cities,

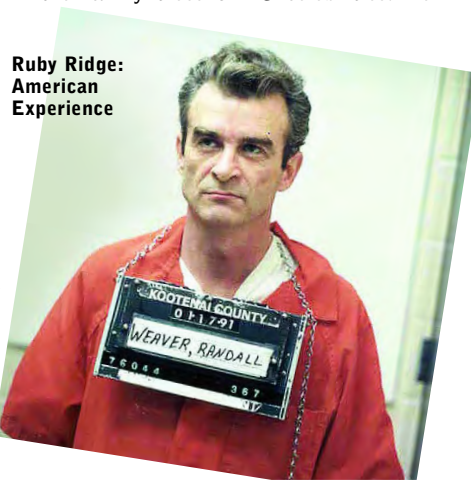

Oklahoma City: American Experience

Tuesday, February 7 at 9 p.m.

On April 19, 1995, Timothy McVeigh, a former soldier deeply influenced by the literature and ideas of the radical right, set off a truck bomb that destroyed the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building, killing 168 people and injuring 675 others. This special traces the events that led McVeigh to that day and recounts the stories of survivors, first responders, U.S. Marshals, FBI investigators and journalists who covered the attack. The film also provides an in-depth and provocative exploration of the extremist anti-government movement that rose to prominence in the 1990s and still makes news today. **Repeats Sunday, February 12 at noon.**

Ruby Ridge: American Experience

Tuesday, February 14 at 9 p.m.

In 1992 FBI agents surrounded the remote cabin of Randy Weaver at Ruby Ridge. Eleven days later, the standoff that mesmerized the nation would leave Weaver injured, his wife, son and a federal agent dead. Many were convinced that the federal government was out of control. This special is a riveting, minute-by-minute account of the event that helped give rise to the modern American militia movement, including interviews with Weaver's daughter and federal agents involved in the confrontation.

Mercy Street (Season 2)

Sundays at 8 p.m.

The much-acclaimed Civil War-era drama set in the occupied city of Alexandria, Virginia follows the doctors, nurses and soldiers, as well as free, enslaved and contraband African Americans, as they navigate the new world emerging from the most cataclysmic event in our country's history. **The series is pre-empted on February 26, with the final episode airing on Sunday, March 5.** Please see page 18 for details.

In Their Own Words: Muhammad Ali

Monday, February 6 at 10 p.m.

He changed boxing almost as much as he changed the world. Follow Muhammad Ali's rise from Columbia Gym in Louisville, Kentucky to international fame, as he transcended his great athletic achievements to become one of the most influential

Americans of his time. His once-polarizing figure ultimately became a beloved and honored national hero. Witness key events unfold in Ali's life, including his stunning conversion to Islam and his change of name, his dramatic stand against the Vietnam-era draft, his three-year exile from the ring, his legendary comeback fights, his courageous battle with Parkinson's disease, and his inspirational reemergence on the world stage at the 1996 Atlanta Olympics. Hear from Ali's family, NFL great Jim Brown, boxing champion Sugar Ray Leonard, boxing promoter Bob Arum and biographer Thomas Hauser, among others.

Smokey Robinson: The Library of Congress Gershwin Prize for Popular Song

Friday, February 10 at 9 p.m.

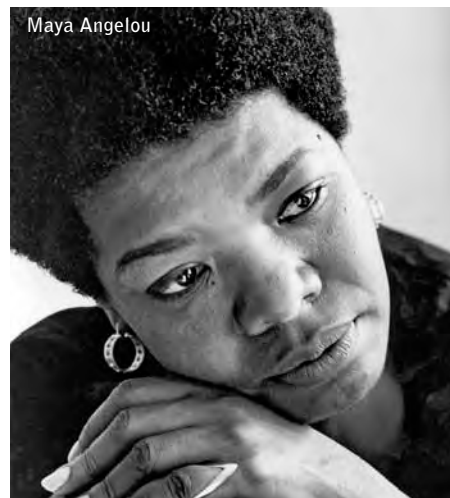

Get in the Way: The Journey of John Lewis

Friday, February 10 at 10:30 p.m.

In 1965, the historic Selma march known as Bloody Sunday was a turning point in the civil-rights movement. John Lewis — now a revered U.S. congressman, then a young student — co-led peaceful protesters seeking voting rights for African Americans in the South. Coming face to

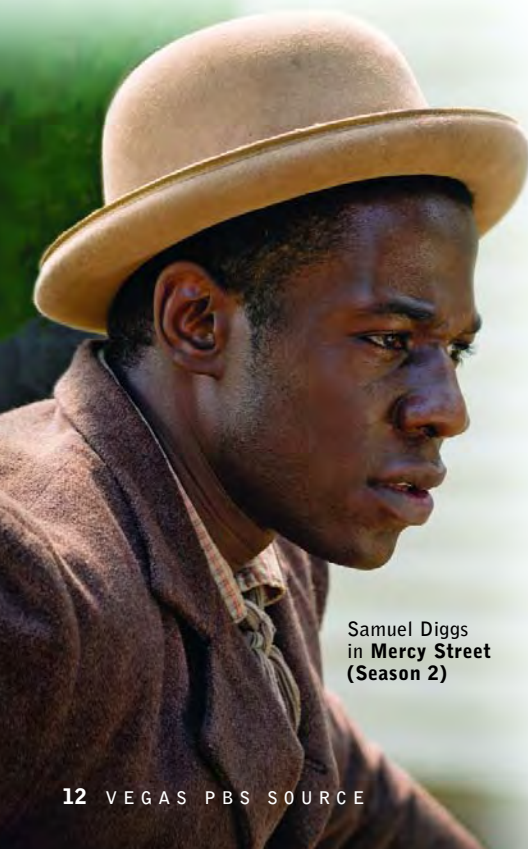


face with a wall of club-wielding Alabama state troopers, Lewis maintained a steadfast, nonviolent stand. Hours later, televised images of the ensuing assault shocked Americans to the core as they witnessed appalling racial oppression. Lewis continues to practice nonviolence in his unwavering fight for justice.

Independent Lens: Birth of a Movement

Sunday, February 12 at 11 p.m.

In 1915, D. W. Griffith released *The Birth of a Nation*, opening as America was celebrating the 50th anniversary of the Civil War. Originally titled *The Clansman*, it was virulently racist, depicting the KKK as heroes and African Americans in the most racist caricatures imaginable. The film was lauded in the press and became the first film ever to screen in the White House. This new special recounts the little-known story of the battle waged against the film by an early and largely forgotten civil rights activist named William Monroe Trotter. Angered by the film's unrepentant racism, Trotter led African Americans in a pitched battle against the film's exhibition, laying the foundation for the civil rights movement to come. In the wake of the “#OscarsSoWhite” controversy, the rise of the Black Lives Matter movement, and increasing social and political turmoil, the documentary traces the line between Griffith's controversial epic and Hollywood's continued legacy of misrepresentation and negative racial stereotypes. The film features interviews with historians, writers and filmmakers including Spike Lee, Reginald Hudlin, Jelani Cobb, Vincent Brown and Henry Louis Gates, Jr. Narrated by Danny Glover.

African Americans: The Las Vegas Experience

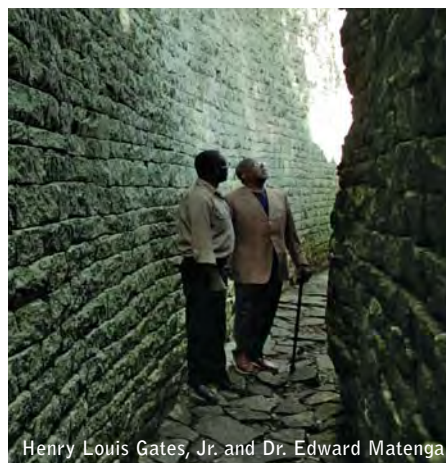
Monday, February 20 at 9 p.m.

Discover the momentous events that defined the African American experience in Las Vegas throughout the Civil Rights era. These events altered the city's history and changed thousands of lives. For example, the Moulin Rouge Agreement of 1960 affected residents as it desegregated the city while the Westside Riot of 1969 rocked the entire community to its core. Our story introduces individuals who are connected to these events, and to each other. Featured interviewees include Claytee White, Dr. Earnest Bracey, Robert Stoldal, Dr. Sylvester S. Rogers, Jean Childs, Hannah Brown, Helen Anderson Toland, Theron Goynes, Naomi Goynes, John Edmond, Agnes Marshall, Jarmilla McMillan Arnold, Ruby Amie-Pilot, Henry L. Reagan Jr., Leonard Polk, Claudette Enus, Jackie Brantley and Eva Simmons. *Repeats Thursday, February 23 at 10 p.m. and Sunday, February 26 at noon.*

The Talk – Race in America

Monday, February 20 at 10 p.m.

This two-hour documentary explores the increasingly common conversation taking place in homes and communities across the country between parents of color and their children, especially sons, about how to behave if they are ever stopped by the police. In many homes, "the talk," as it is called, usually contains phrases like this: If you are stopped by the police: Always answer "yes sir, no sir"; never talk back; don't make any sudden movements; don't put your hands in your pockets; obey all commands; if you think you are falsely

accused, save it for the police station. I would rather pick you up at the station than the morgue... The film will present six personal stories to illustrate the issue from multiple points of view: parent, child, the police and the community, along with interviews with academics, police force members and community activists.

American Masters:

Maya Angelou: And Still I Rise

Tuesday, February 21 at 8 p.m.

This is the first documentary feature about the incomparable Dr. Maya Angelou (1928-2014), best known for her autobiography "I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings." The film weaves her words with rare and intimate archival photographs and videos that paint hidden moments of her exuberant life during some of America's most defining moments. From her upbringing in the Depression-era South to her work with Malcolm X in Ghana, to her inauguration poem for President Bill Clinton, the film takes an incredible journey through the life of a true American icon. This special features a remarkable series of interviews with friends and family, including Clinton, Oprah Winfrey, Common, Alfre Woodard, Cicely Tyson, Quincy Jones, Hillary Clinton, John Singleton and Dr. Angelou's son, Guy Johnson.

Africa's Great Civilizations

Monday - Wednesday,

February 27 - March 1 at 9 p.m.

Henry Louis Gates, Jr. provides a new look at African history from an African perspective, traversing the dawn of mankind to the dawn of the 20th century. The series is a breathtaking and personal journey through history that includes evidence of the earliest human culture and art, arguably the world's greatest ever civilizations, and some of the world's earliest writing. 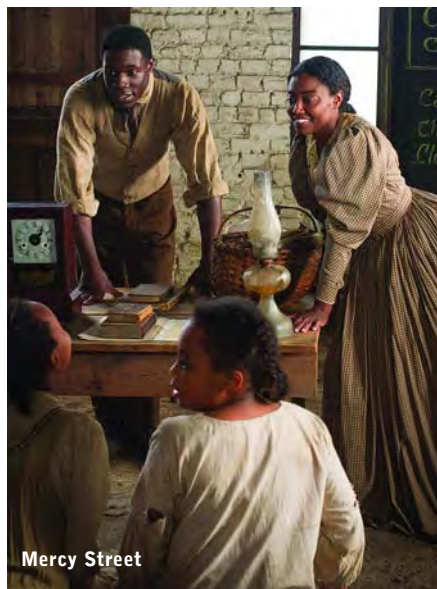

Smokey Robinson: The Library of Congress Gershwin Prize for Popular Song

Enjoy an all-star tribute to Smokey Robinson, the 2016 recipient of the Library of Congress Gershwin Prize for Popular Song, hosted by Samuel L. Jackson. The special features performances by Robinson, as well as Aloe Blacc, Gallant, CeeLo Green, JoJo, Kip Moore, Corinne Bailey Rae, BeBe Winans and a special appearance by Berry Gordy, Founder of Motown. A rhythm and blues icon whose career has spanned more than 50 years, Robinson is considered the

poet laureate of soul. His velvet falsetto and incomparable mastery of lyrical verse have created a tapestry of hits that have transcended generations and become a mainstay in American pop music. As a producer, record executive and visionary, Robinson helped lead a musical revolution called the Motown sound.

Great Performance: NYC Ballet in Paris

Friday, February 17 at 9 p.m.

During the summer of 2016, New York City Ballet made a triumphant return to Paris for a three-week season at the historic Théâtre du Châtelet. The engagement's closing night performance, featuring four ballets by NYCB co-founder George Balanchine to the music of French composers, will now air as a special two-part broadcast. The first program opens with *Walpurgisnacht Ballet*, set to music by Charles Gounod, and originally choreographed for a Paris Opera Ballet production of the opera *Faust* in 1975. First performed as an independent work by NYCB in 1980, *Walpurgisnacht Ballet* is a joyful embodiment of classical choreography, ending with a surging finale that sends 24 ballerinas soaring across the

stage. The first program culminates with *La Valse*, set to the music of Maurice Ravel. A neo-Romantic from 1951, *La Valse* depicts a young woman at a ball who is simultaneously horrified and fascinated by her own vanity, and finds herself strangely drawn to a figure of death.

Great Performance: NYC Ballet Symphony in C

Friday, February 24 at 9 p.m.

The second program opens with *Sonatine*, a pas de deux of polished simplicity and emotional interplay to the music of Maurice Ravel. Originally created in 1975 for French-born dancers Violette Verdy and Jean-Pierre Bonnefoux, it is danced here by Megan Fairchild and Joaquín De Luz with solo pianist Elaine Chelton. The finale of the two-part Great Performances special is *Balanchine's Symphony in C*, a signature work of the New York City Ballet to a score by Georges Bizet. This landmark ballet in four movements is performed by more than 50 dancers, including Tiler Peck, Andrew Veyette, Teresa Reichlen, Tyler Angle, Alston Macgill, Anthony Huxley, Brittany Pollack, and Taylor Stanley. The program will also feature music performed by l'Orchestre Prométhée led by NYCB Resident Conductor Daniel Capps.

Spotlight on Philanthropy

Longtime Vegas PBS member Janice Allen's favorite thing to say about Vegas PBS is that "Anybody can sponsor public television programs!"

But Janice Allen isn't just anybody.

Born September 21, 1927 in Sebring, Ohio, Janice grew up enjoying ice skating and swimming. As a high school senior, she became a full-time reporter for *The Alliance Review*, and wrote all about her town for the publication. She also was homecoming queen. In 1945, she left to attend West Virginia Wesleyan College. She left Wesleyan to marry her first husband, former flight instructor and Air Corp officer Ernest Haupt in 1947. After seeing a four-page spread on Las Vegas in *Life Magazine*, Janice fell in love with the west and decided to honeymoon in Las Vegas. Janice even helped fly the plane here, landing on a dirt runway! Her honeymoon with Las Vegas never ended and she and Ernest moved here in 1948, which she says is "the best decision I ever made." She and Ernest (now deceased) had two sons, Gary and Craig Haupt, both deceased. She became Janice Allen, when she married her late husband Fred in 1984.

In the nearly 70 years she has lived here, Janice has made a remarkable difference in our community. She is a Founder of The Smith Center, donating 1 million dollars to the creation of Las Vegas' first performing arts center and serves on The Smith Center President's Advisory Board. She is a 55-year member of The Junior League of Las Vegas as well as two-time president of the organization, and was honored in 2008 with The Junior League's "Lifetime Community Achievement Award." She also was a member of the Las Vegas Art Museum Board. Most recently, UNLV's Oral History Research Department published a book on Janice's life and her many achievements in our community.

And at Vegas PBS, she has made an enormous impact. Because she was a writer herself (Janice worked at the *Evening Review-Journal* – which became the *Las Vegas Review Journal* – and had a career writing articles for national magazines, including *Ladies' Home Journal*, and working in television and radio production), she has been passionate about sponsoring the



annual PBS KIDS Writers Contest, and has done so for three years. Janice also has sponsored a multitude of program series including **Downton Abbey on Masterpiece**, **Mr. Selfridge on Masterpiece**, **Masterpiece Contemporary: Worricker**, **Doc Martin**, **The Roosevelts: An Intimate History**, **FRONTLINE**, **The Madoff Affair**, **Great Performances**, **Secrets of Henry VIII's Palace**, and many others as well as one-time local productions such as **Frankie Moreno Songs at Home** and **Alan Cumming Sings Sappy Songs**, which was recorded at The Smith Center and recently featured as part of the national PBS Fall Arts Festival. She also is sponsoring the new **Victoria on Masterpiece** program. In addition, she became a public spokesperson for **Downton Abbey on Masterpiece** and **Doc Martin** in 2015-16, generously and faithfully promoting both programs at church groups and most recently at the International Women's Forum. She has been a featured speaker at several of our Downton Abbey teas, as well as our most recent Victoria Tea, which was held at Caesars Palace this past December.

Independent Lens: Tower

Tuesday, February 14 at 10 p.m.

On August 1, 1966, a sniper rode the elevator to the top floor of the University of Texas Tower and opened fire, holding the campus hostage for 96 minutes. When the gunshots were finally silenced, the toll included 16 dead, three dozen wounded and a shaken nation left trying to understand. Combining archival footage with rotoscopic animation, this special reveals the action-packed, untold stories of the witnesses, heroes and survivors of America's first mass school shooting, when the worst in one man brought out the best in so many others. The history is told through the first-person stories of seven specific characters: two students who were shot, the two police officers who ended the siege, two civilians who provided aid and the radio reporter who broadcast live from the scene.

Richard Pryor Icon

Monday, February 13 at 10 p.m.

From his troubled upbringing in the slums of Peoria, Illinois, to his brave battle against multiple sclerosis, from performing on the *Ed Sullivan Show* to being banned by the networks, this special examines the roller coaster life and times of the groundbreaking entertainer who changed the rules of comedy. Though he was one of the most successful and influential entertainers of his generation, Pryor wrestled with self-destructive behaviors that threatened his life. The documentary explores Pryor's transformation from a straight-laced comedian to one of the most controversial and thought-provoking acts of his time. Sex, drugs, race – nothing was off limits. Pryor opened the door for other comedians to inject social commentary and other once-verboten topics into their humor. Featured are interviews with close personal friends and comedians he influenced, including Tracy Morgan and George Lopez.

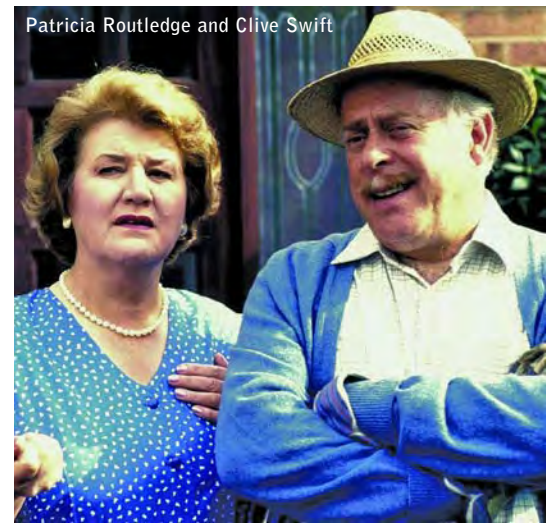
