This bi-monthly magazine is only one reflection of that. Like our new name, it will allow us to feature all we have to offer from PBS and right here at home!

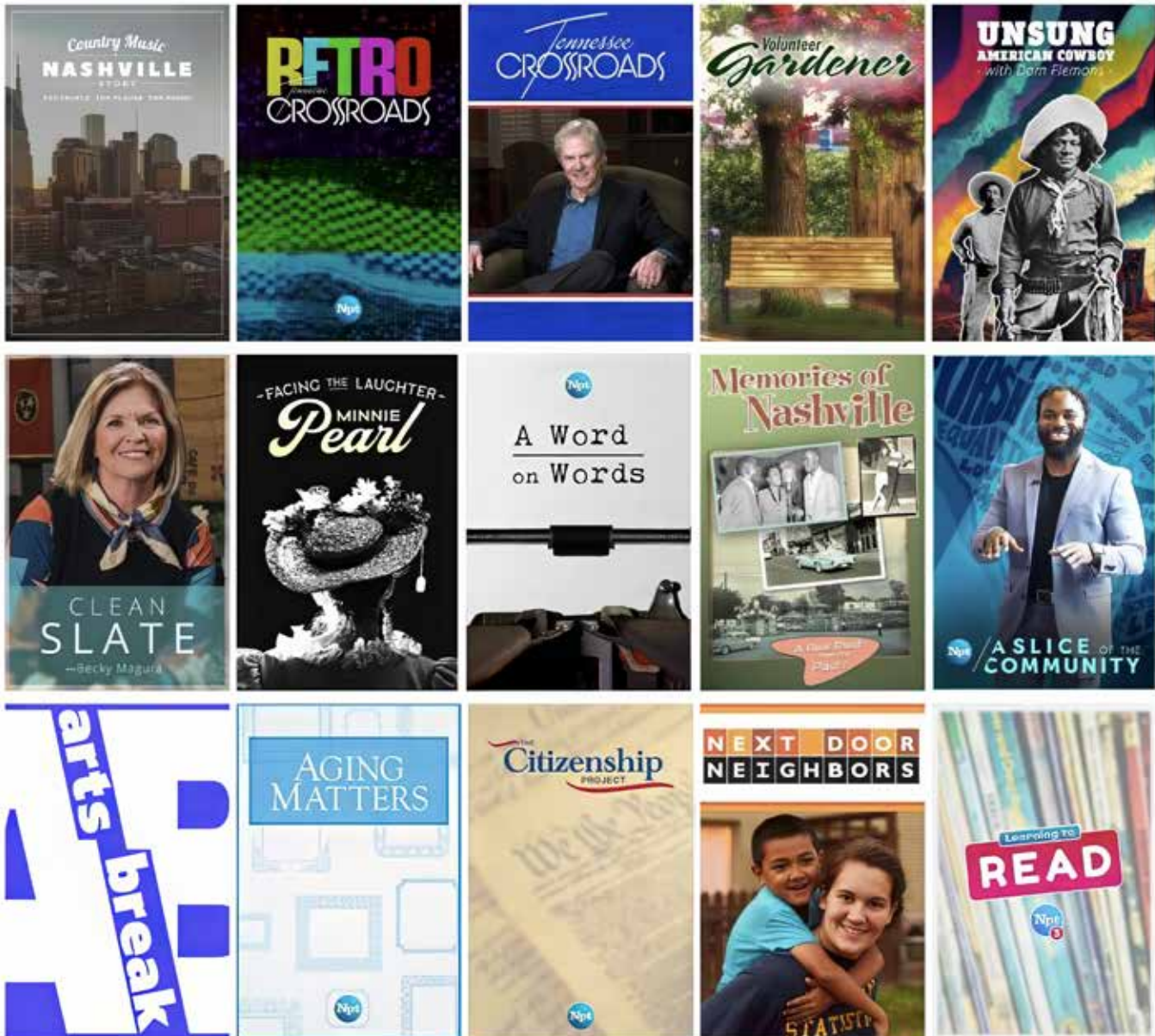

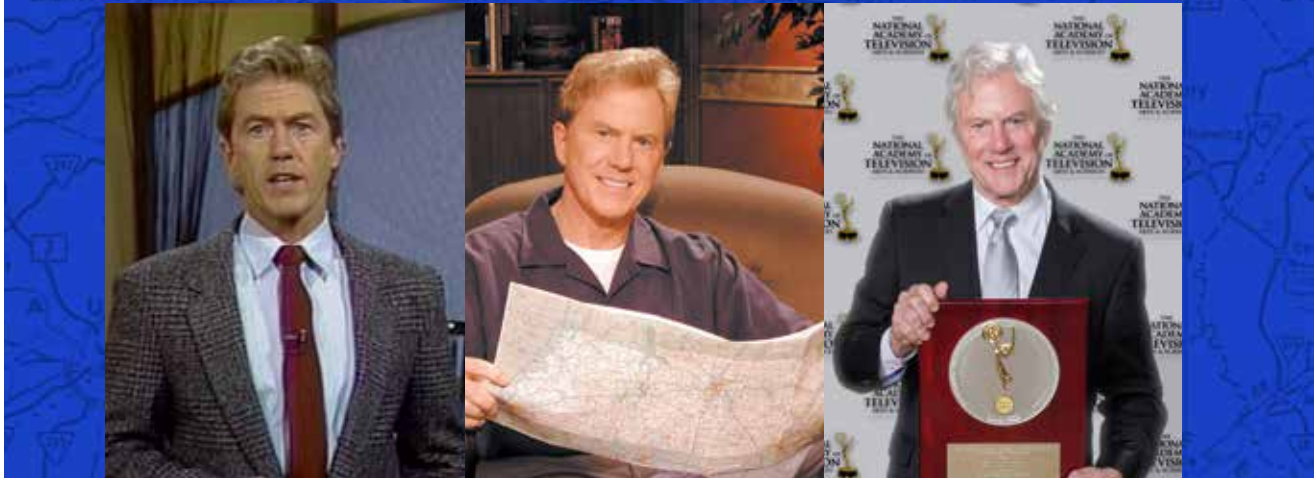

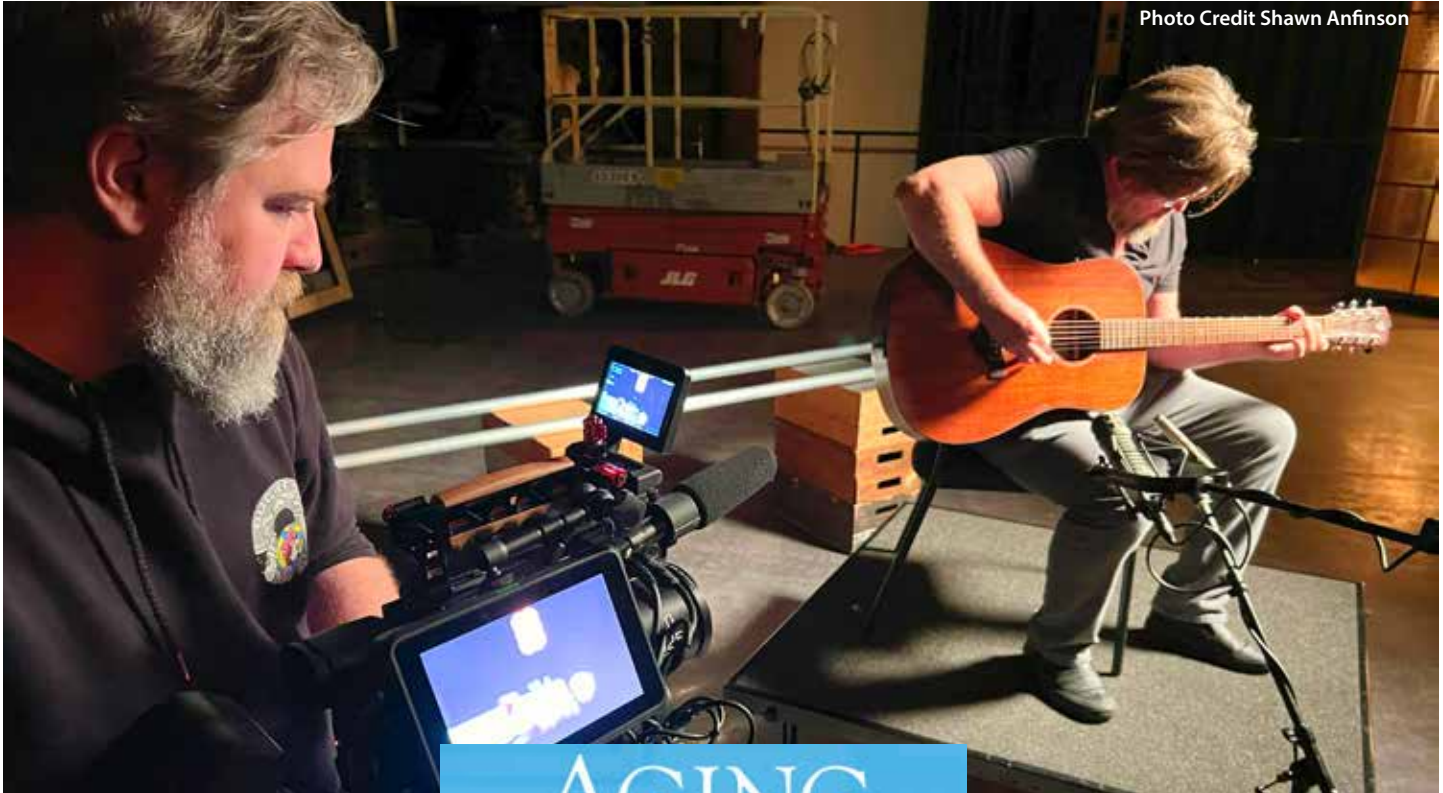

Spotlight on Jamie Pfeffer

Jamie Pfeffer, a Nashville Native, is a founding principal and architect at Pfeffer Torode, where he leads an interdisciplinary team to create spaces that enrich and strengthen communities. Trained at Auburn's School of Architecture and with a Master in Building Construction, Jamie's work integrates art and architecture, focusing on contextual responses to natural conditions and promoting well-being. His projects span residential, office, retail, and food and beverage spaces, aiming to inspire community engagement and provoke new perspectives.

I'd love to start by having you share a bit about your background, particularly your work in architecture, and your connection to Nashville PBS.

Sure, I grew up in Nashville, so it's home for me. I've always had an interest in architecture and pursued that passion through my studies and career. My work is deeply rooted in the vernacular of the South, understanding Nashville's legacy while using broader perspectives to expand and deepen the conversation around architecture here.

Our offices are located in East Nashville, which has significantly influenced my approach to architecture. East Nashville is an amazing historic neighborhood with a rich history as a pedestrian streetcar community. It was one of the most important neighborhoods at the turn of the century, with a major transit strategy involving streetcars done by Percy Warner. The area has faced various historical challenges, from fires to tornadoes, and has experienced significant changes due to urban growth patterns and biases. This history inspires me to create spaces that honor the past while looking ahead to the future.

Many of the issues Nashville faces today can be seen through the microcosm of East Nashville.

One of my favorite books is "Invisible Cities" by Italo Calvino, where Marco Polo recounts his travels to Kublai Khan. At some point, Khan asks if he ever left Venice, implying that all the amazing stories could have happened within Venice. I think Nashville has that same potential.

When you visit Nashville, you're not just visiting a city, you're experiencing its unique neighborhoods like Cleveland Park, McFerrin Park, 12 South, Wedgwood-Houston, and more. Each neighborhood is a part of the Nashville experience and contributes to the city's dynamic character. These nuances are not divisions but roots that form a broader, growing dynamic of Nashville.

Growing up, PBS was a significant part of my experience, sharing amazing local stories and providing a broader lens on the world. Programs like Tennessee Crossroads and various history shows exemplify this blend of local and expansive storytelling, which resonates with me.

Your connection to different neighborhoods seems to tie into the concept of "For the Love of Nashville." Could you share how you came up with that phrase and what it means to you?

"For the Love of Nashville" is a mentality and a lens I use to guide my work. Growing up here, I wanted to bring back experiences from elsewhere and apply them to Nashville. I see my design work as a love letter to Nashville, aiming to bring a level of thought and design that advances our city. It's about seeking solutions and celebrating Nashville's unique identity.

How do you see "For the Love of Nashville" correlating with Nashville PBS?

Nashville PBS, through its programming, shares local stories while providing a broader perspective. Shows like SESAME STREET offered early education while being engaging for all ages, much like how PBS connects various age groups through its content. Programs like TENNESSEE CROSSROADS showcase local stories, expanding our understanding of Nashville. I think Nashville PBS can stand on the history of Nashville while expanding into new narratives.

What were your thoughts on our office space and architecture when you visited?

The Nashville PBS location in Wedgewood Houston is at an interesting crossroad in time and space. The building, historically more closed off, could benefit from an outward posture, connecting more with the community. Public television has a unique role in being a unifying voice accessible to all, and the physical space should reflect that, bringing people in and fostering community engagement.

Were you a Channel 8 kid?

Absolutely, Channel 8 all the way! SEASAME STREET was a big part of my childhood. The show had so many great layers and characters, appealing to kids while also being subversively funny for adults. It was all about early education, and it had a mission and purpose that really stuck with me.

With the changing nature of broadcast and media, how do you see the role of public television evolving?

With the rise of subscription-based platforms, media is becoming increasingly siloed, requiring various subscriptions to access different content. Public television, like Nashville PBS, has the unique role of being a unifying voice accessible to everyone. It doesn't require a subscription and can reach a broad audience, fostering a sense of community and shared experience. The physical space of Nashville PBS should embody this public posture, connecting with the community and being a hub for creativity and collaboration. This connection to the public is crucial for telling inclusive, diverse stories that resonate with Nashville's spirit.

What's your favorite way to spend a day in Nashville, and what do you love most about the city?

I love exploring Nashville's layers and depth, learning about its past, present, and future. For example, after watching a TENNESSEE CROSSROADS piece, where my friend Vicki Yates did a segment as a correspondent of the program, I visited the Triple Crown Bakery in Franklin. It's about connecting with new places and understanding more about the city.

What are your hopes for Nashville PBS as we move into this new era?

I believe Nashville's DNA celebrates creativity and collaboration. Nashville PBS can embody this by being a resource platform that facilitates creative and collaborative processes. It should be a space where people can create and share stories, reflecting Nashville's spirit and expanding its unique voice.

Is there anything else you'd like to share about your work or business?

Our firm focuses on using design to create transformative change in the built environment, aiming to create both beauty and value. We see design as a powerful tool for creating exponential value and inspiring conversations and solutions.

DISPARITIES & HEALTH EQUITY: A PUBLIC SCREENING

In May, NPT partnered with TSU's Dr. Cara Robinson to host a screening and panel for AGING MATTERS: DISPARITIES & HEALTH EQUITY.

The film centers around how the COVID-19 pandemic revealed shocking disparities in health outcomes based on race and ethnicity, highlighting long-standing inequities among BIPOC Americans. The causes range from barriers to health care access, standards that discriminate, and blatant racism. The result can mean a shorter, poorer quality of life.

This edition of AGING MATTERS focuses on health disparities among older adults. Film producer LaTonya Turner moderated a discussion between Aimalohi Ahonkhai, MD, MPH with Massachusetts General Hospital, and Mark Yancy, CEO of NashvilleHealth, about the importance of advocacy and how to ask the right questions when seeking medical help.

This event was a part of the 2024 CARES Conference where over 111 experts and trainers focused on addressing challenges among aging and vulnerable adults from around the country.
