














GIVING HER OLD CAR NEW LIFE





From emergency alerts to educational programming, PBS member stations play a vital role in public safety — keeping communities informed, connected, and prepared when it matters most.



Emergency Alert System (EAS)

Stations provide life-saving alerts by inserting EAS messages into their over-the-air broadcasts. As key participants in the national alerting system, PBS stations deliver emergency messages quickly and reliably, keeping communities informed during emergencies.



Earthquake Early Warning

West coast stations partner with state governments to reduce earthquake early warning alert delivery times from 30 seconds to 1 second.



Emergency Operations Centers

Stations offer hardened facilities with generator backup to ensure continuous operation during emergencies and host public agencies during a crisis.



On-Air Programming

Stations air a variety of public safety-related programming, including official briefings, disaster preparation, substance abuse prevention, health education, and childappropriate education.



Public Safety Infrastructure Support

Stations' hardened transmission sites host a variety state and federal agencies, including NOAA, state police, FEMA, Homeland Security, the U.S. Coast Guard, and local emergency management.



Emergency Operations Plans & Committees

Stations participate in Emergency
Operation Plans, playing a
critical role in ensuring timely
communications during
emergencies. Many sit on their
state's SECC, overseeing public
safety messaging.



Renaissance: The Blood and the Beauty

Tuesdays, July 8 - 22 at 8pm

Framed through the eyes of Michelangelo, the series traces more than sixty years, beginning with the Pazzi Conspiracy of 1478 and concluding with the unveiling of *The Last Judgement* in 1541. Through stunning visuals, compelling storytelling, and historical insight, the series reveals how these artists battled for favor, risked everything in service of their patrons, and reshaped the world's understanding of art and the artist.

July 8 - Rise

Michelangelo and Leonardo struggle to win work in the brutal world of Renaissance Italy, navigating the shifting politics of powerful patrons and violent city-states. In Florence, young Michelangelo rises under the Medici's patronage while Leonardo builds his reputation in Milan.

July 15 – Rivalry

Florence is a hotbed of creative competition as Michelangelo and Leonardo return to the city and battle for artistic supremacy. When Michelangelo is awarded the commission for David, Leonardo seeks to outshine him with technical innovation. The arrival of the young prodigy Raphael threatens both men.

July 22 - Redemption

While Michelangelo paints the Sistine Chapel ceiling, Raphael ascends in the Pope's favor while working on his private apartments. But shortly after the completion of the Sistine ceiling, the Pope dies, and as the Protestant Reformation tears through Europe, art becomes a battle-ground for ideology and power. As the new Pope seeks to reassert Catholic supremacy, Michelangelo is commissioned for a depiction of *The Last Judgement*, which will become both a political statement and a very personal expression of Michelangelo's own spiritual redemption.




The Great American Recipe Season 4

Fridays, July 11 - August 15 at 8:30pm

PBS's popular cooking competition series, returns for its fourth season with new home cooks from across the United States ready to showcase their signature dishes that reflect their unique backgrounds and culinary stories. Award-winning chefs and restaurateurs Tiffany Derry and Timothy Hollingsworth, along with SPLENDID TABLE host Francis Lam, return as judges to guide and encourage them along the way, while Alejandra Ramos returns as host.

An upbeat cooking competition that spotlights the incredible variety of tastes and traditions found across the country, Season 4 of THE GREAT AMERICAN RECIPE introduces eight new talented cooks preparing their most beloved recipes. Each week, the judges determine who has the winning dish, and, in the final episode, the top three compete for a chance to win this year's competition. Professor T Season 4

Series Premiere Sun, Aug 24 at 7pm

This season picks up six months after the shocking events of Season 3, where DS Lisa Donckers died. The team must grapple with the loss as a new wave of dangerous crimes sweeps through Cambridge. Professor T, who has a new musical interest, is also more engaged in his lectures. His mother, Adelaide, and his therapist, Helena, also experience personal developments, including romance.

Episode 1– Carpe Diem

Jasper is no longer consulting for the police. But when a woman disappears from a yacht, his therapist asks him to once again get involved.

Episode 2 – September Gardens

While Jasper visits a home for the elderly, a woman is killed by one of the people living there. But there may be more to the murder than meets the eye.

Episode 3 – The Inspection

A school inspector is killed, first by five stab wounds, and then by being smothered.

Episode 4 – You Can't Kill Me

A stage prop knife is substituted by a real knife. Who did the switch and why?

Marlow Murder Club Season 2

Series Premiere Sun, Aug 24 at 8pm

While life in the idyllic town of Marlow has just about returned to normal after a chain of murders rattled the tightly knit community, it's not long before retired archaeologist Judith Potts, dog-walker Suzie Harris, and Vicar's wife Becks Starling are called back into action to solve a series of new crimes that befall the local residents.

Episode 1– *Death Comes To Marlow, Part 1* When a wealthy baronet dies alone in his study the day before his wedding, Judith, Becks, and Suzie find themselves at the center of another puzzling and complicated mystery.

Episode 2 – *Death Comes To Marlow, Part 2*As the suspects' alibis stack up, Judith, Becks, and Suzie are pushed to their limits. Will they be able to solve the puzzling murder of Sir Peter before anyone else gets hurt?

Episode 3 – *Death On The Close, Part 1*When a man with no ID and no connection to Marlow is found dead in the middle of a suburban road, Judith, Becks, and Suzie delve into secrets between the residents.

Episode 4 – *Death On The Close, Part 2*A surprising link to a past missing persons case shines a new light on the residents of Linnet Close for Judith, Becks and Suzie, but could they be responsible for murder on their doorstep?

Episode 5 – *Sailing Close To The Wind, Part 1* After a revered member of the sailing club is brutally bludgeoned to death, Judith, Becks, and Suzie must navigate simmering grudges within the tight-knit community on the hunt for justice

Episode 6 – *Sailing Close To The Wind, Part 1* As the motives stack up against suspects Gregg and Harry, Kit's killer sends another violent warning and Judith, Becks and Suzie find themselves in a race against time to solve the case.



Unforgotten, Season 6 Series Premiere Sun, Aug 24 at 9pm

The detectives are on a mission to uncover the mystery behind an unsolved murder that occurred 39 years ago. Beneath the ground of a demolished house, the bones of the victim are found. With this evidence, the modern police team open a case to unearth the history that has remained buried for decades.

Episode 1– When a spine is dredged out of Whitney Marsh, a new case begins for Jess and Sunny's team at Bishop Street CID. Four potential suspects, Juliet, Melinda, Asif, and Marty, each have secrets to hide.

Episode 2 – The Bishop Street team investigate Gerry Cooper's record, relationships, and enemies. Jess and Sunny make contact with his widow, Juliet. More layers to the suspects' lives are revealed, and none of them are as innocent as they first seem.

Episode 3 – The team discover Asif, Mel, and Marty's connections to Gerry, and bring Marty in; Gerry Cooper's descent into nationalism is revealed, as well as his violent streak; as Jess reaches out to her sister, Leanne and Sunny's friendship evolves.

Episode 4 – With the details of Gerry Cooper's life becoming clearer and one suspect already being questioned, the Bishop Street team find suspects further afield. And if Mel and Asif have nothing to hide, why do they claim not to remember Gerry?

Episode 5 – Lies are uncovered as Mel and Asif are taken into custody. Juliet tries to protect Taylor, and herself, from the investigation, and a possible witness to the body's disposal is found. And Jess plans a conversation with Steve.

Episode 6 – For better or worse, Jess and Sunny finally get the truth from Asif, Marty, Mel, and Juliet, and Gerry Cooper's killer is revealed. But both on and off the case, the truth leads to difficult decisions.



Clearing the Air: The War on Smog

Tues, Aug 26 at 8pm

In the summer of 1943, a thick noxious haze of smog enveloped the Los Angeles region. Residents complained of burning eyes and lungs, and some experienced nausea. The physical distress caused by the haze was so bad that many feared it was a Japanese chemical warfare attack.

Over the next several years, the problem reached crisis proportions. Farmers began complaining of discolored lettuce, wilted crops, and dying produce. Many suspected emissions from sulfur-emitting factories had caused the foul air, but a chemist at the California Institute of Technology had a different theory. Arie Haagen-Smit determined that the smog was the result of sunlight breaking down incompletely burned gasoline and other hydrocarbons found in car emissions.

Meanwhile, across the country, toxicologist Mary Amdur made a disturbing discovery: the combined effects of air pollutants, even when not lethal, she determined, could cause permanent damage to lungs.

Both Haagen-Smit and Amdur would suffer reprisals from entrenched industries threatened by their discoveries, but as the 1950s progressed, ordinary citizens became active in the fight to address air pollution across the country until, in 1963, President Lyndon B. Johnson signed into law the Clean Air Act, one of the nation's first environmental laws.

WAR ON SMOG tells the story of the epic struggle against airborne toxins that lead to a national reckoning about air quality and the creation of the Clean Air Act.



SPOTLIGHT - JESSICA "JELLY" MALENGA

Jessica "Jelly" Malenga is a heart-led educator, creator, and founder of Learn With Jelly, a joyful learning enrichment program designed to spark connection, creativity, and confidence in young children and their families. With over 25 years of experience in early childhood education, she is known for creating meaningful, memory-making experiences through play, storytelling, and hands-on enrichment. Through her program, she empowers caregivers to take an active, joy-filled role in their child's learning journey.

Through Learn With Jelly, she offers cooking classes, themed activity pages, story-based learning kits, and interactive enrichment that meets families where they are. A Spanish immersion series is also on the horizon, an extension of her heart for accessible and inclusive learning.

Jelly is also the author of Sea Pals, a children's book that invites readers into a vibrant underwater friendship adventure.

In addition to her work with children and families, she coaches early learning professionals, supporting them in building purposeful, heart-centered businesses rooted in care, creativity, and sustainability.

As a Nashville PBS Community Educator, she leads media literacy workshops for students and families while equipping educators with tools that bring intentionality and joy into the classroom. By affirming the timeless comfort and connection PBS represents, her work helps families and educators feel seen, supported, and safe in a media-rich world.

Carolyn Adkerson (CA): Let's start with who you are and your connection to Nashville PBS.

Jessica "Jelly" Malenga [Community Educator] (JM)): I'm a natural born Zambian-American educator and creator with over 25 years of experience teaching children across three countries. I lead and create playful experiences that spark curiosity. I'm also a mentor to youth, a coach to early learning professionals, and an adopted auntie to children in four countries and five states. As a children's author, aspiring children's music artist, community activist, and family advocate, I'm on a mission to inspire young minds and the grownups who guide them through creativity, connection, and joyful learning.

I first connected with PBS three years ago when I met Rosemary while volunteering with the African American Cultural Alliance in the children's area at the Celebrate Nashville Festival.

CA: What is your role today?

JM: I teach media literacy lessons to children, from kindergarten through fifth grade, helping them make smart choices and stay safe online. I always begin my sessions by telling each child, "You are important." It might be the first time someone has said that to them. One kid once said, "But you don't even know me." I told them, "I don't have to know you to know that you matter." If they remember nothing else, I want them to carry that with them.

CA: What's been one of your most memorable experiences in this role?

JM: When PBS launched Lyla in the Loop, my first assignment was at Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital at Vanderbilt. I broadcast live from the Ryan Seacrest Studios to 300 hospital rooms. We bring books and timers to encourage safe online habits. It was very personal for me—I spent time in a children's hospital as a child, so I know how scary it can be. Now, I get to bring joy and connect with these kids. One time, a five-year-old came running down the hall yelling, "Is she still there? I'm here for my high five!" His clothes were on backward because he didn't want to waste time getting ready. That moment really stayed with me.

CA: You've shared that PBS was meaningful for you growing up. How did that shape your connection?

JM: I'm half Zambian and came to America in the late '80s—a tough time to be visibly different. I was teased about my accent and background, even by teachers. My brother and I were bullied. But when I came home, PBS was there. Everyone on those shows was your friend. They made you feel like being different was okay. I probably watched PBS longer than most kids, but it helped me feel safe. I even practiced phrases from the shows over and over again until my accent faded. PBS helped me find belonging. Now, this work is like affirming the little girl in me who once needed that same reassurance. It's deeply healing and full-circle.

CA: How can families or schools connect with the work you do?

JM: They can contact the Nashville PBS Education Department—Sam and Rosemary truly believe in this work and help make connections happen. Honestly, sometimes I tell Rosemary I don't think she's real. She and Sam are the kindest people, always affirming. Every time I walk in, they greet me with a smile and a hug, like they're genuinely excited I'm there. I've worked in a lot of places, but that kind of love and belief in the work? That's rare.

I also run Learn with Jelly (learnwithjelly.com), an online enrichment program for families with children ages 2–10. We offer virtual cooking classes, play dates, and activities to bring back the magic of connection and learning. And I love reminding parents and teachers that PBS Kids shows are aligned with national educational standards—so kids aren't just watching, they're learning.

CA: Any final thoughts you want to leave with the community?

JM: When I visit schools or events, kids always say, "PBS was here." That's the magic. One third grader came up and said, "I love everything you do." I was so touched—until I realized she thought I made all the PBS shows! When I said, "Oh no, I don't write or produce any of the shows," she paused and said, "Oh. Well then, I don't love everything you do." That humbled me real quick! But even in that moment, I felt so grateful—because it meant she felt something. She felt connected. That's what this is all about. I'm honored to be part of that—and to remind kids, again and again, that they are important.
