
The Honorable Patricia de Stacy Harrison is the longest-serving president and CEO of the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB), overseeing federal funding for more than 1,500 public media stations.

Since 2005, she has expanded support for education, journalism, and digital innovation, launching initiatives like American Graduate,



which has helped raise national high school graduation rates. Under her leadership, CPB has strengthened local journalism collaborations and diversity in media, earning numerous honors, including the Promise of America Award and the Global Communications Award.

A champion for women in leadership, she has authored books and spearheaded initiatives like Women and Girls Lead. Previously, she served as Assistant Secretary of State for Educational and Cultural Affairs, earning the U.S. Secretary of State's Distinguished Service Award. A recipient of multiple honors, including the Ellis Island Medal of Honor, she holds degrees from American University and serves on several prestigious boards, contributing to public service, media, and cultural diplomacy.

Mac, a 45-year veteran of theatre, film, and video, founded three theatres, including Tennessee Repertory Theatre (The Rep), the state's largest regional theatre company, where he produced and directed over 65 productions. After 25 years in theatre, he transitioned to film and video in 2001, co-founding Earnhardt Pirkle, Inc., which served nonprofit and corporate clients. An award-winning creator, Mac has received an ACE Cable Award, multiple Telly Awards, a Parthenon Award, and a Gold Pen Award. He now leads Creative Communications, LLC, a media production company, and serves as President of Southern Stage Productions, Inc., which staged The Nutty Professor musical's world premiere in Nashville in 2012.

A Cumberland Homestead Home

Cumberland Homesteads, near Crossville, was one of the first and most ambitious New Deal projects undertaken during The Great Depression.

Established by the Division of Subsistence Homesteads in 1934, the community was envisioned by federal planners as a model of cooperative living for the region's distressed farmers, coal miners, and factory workers.

The goal was to create a self-sufficient community where residents would have the chance to own their own farms and homes. The federal government purchased approximately 27,000 acres of land to be divided into small farms for resettled

families, as well as communal areas for public buildings, parks, and industrial facilities.

While the project failed to achieve many of its goals the homesteads community survived, with most of the original 251 homes still in use today.

This next episode in the award-winning CITIZENSHIP PROJECT series will explore how New Deal-era objectives and methods, developed for Cumberland Homesteads had an impact on civil rights by combating poverty and inspiring the fight for social justice.







Cromwell is as complex as he is unforgettable: a politician and a fixer, a diplomat and a father, a man who both defied and defined his age

March 23, Episode 1: Wreckage

In the wake of Anne's execution, the King weds Jane Seymour. Marital bliss does nothing to quell Henry's rage at his daughter.

March 30, Episode 2: Obedience

A secret marriage brings scandal to court, giving Cromwell the opportunity to bring his adversary Norfolk down for good.

April 6, Episode 3: Defiance

Rebels in the North demand Cromwell's head and a return to the old Catholic ways.

Marie Antoinette, Season 2

Sundays starting March 23 at 9pm

Season 2 sees Antoinette and Louis facing unprecedented challenges at the height of their power. As financial crises loom across the nation and political rivalries intensify, the royal couple must navigate an increasingly hostile court and a changing France. From Versailles to the Palais Royal, the seeds of a revolution began to take root, threatening the very foundations of France's long-standing monarchy.

March 23, Episode 1: The Worst Winter Marie and Louis embrace modern rule, but enemies lurk everywhere.

March 30, Episode 2: A Poison PenMarie's affair with Fersen reignites – could it be part of a carefully orchestrated plot?

April 6, Episode 3: Treacherous Legacy The people of Paris openly protest against Marie as she protects her unborn child.

April 13, Episode 4: The Pursuit of Happiness

Marie overhauls her image, and the King and Queen find happiness when they experience a taste of "ordinary" life.

Call The Midwife, Season 14

Sundays starting March 30 at 7pm

The multi-award-winning drama enters a new decade, the 1970s, which brings with it new challenges for Nonnatus House - and to British society. Seaon 14 brings us more truthful and tender stories, as always rich in compassion and heroism. The 1970s start as they mean to go on, with Nonnatus House plunged into disarray when activists staging a bid for independence blockade access to the Isle of Dogs. Amid the poverty and uncertainty of life in a declining Docklands, the midwives must also face cases of manic depression, gonorrhea, spina bifida, abortion – and an apparently immaculate conception.

An apparent immaculate conception causes consternation at Nonnatus House.

April 6, Episode 2

Trixie cares for a single mother recently discharged from a psychiatric hospital.

April 13, Episode 3

April 27, Episode 5

The Nonnatus team oversee the care of a man living inside an iron lung.

American Masters: Liza Truly Terrific Absolutely True Story

Tues, April 1 at 10pm

"Truly Terrific Absolutely True Story" were the words Liza Minnelli used in her iconic introduction for the song *Ring The Bells* at her 1972 New York concert.

Following in the footsteps of her mother, the legendary Judy Garland, Minnelli used her boundless raw talent to overcome hardship and build her own legacy, with support from mentors like Kay Thompson, Fred Ebb, Charles Aznavour, Halston and Bob Fosse.

The story features participation from many friends who know her well – Michael Feinstein, Mia Farrow, Ben Vereen, Joel Grey, and the late Chita Rivera, along with the star herself.

Born with a spotlight on her life, Liza's story has never been told absolutely or truly. From the speculation that her beloved godmother Kay Thompson's "Eloise" series was about her to the gossip rags that hounded her for decades, many were searching for insight into the talented and charismatic performer, but few got it right. This equal parts eye-opening, thoughtful and hilarious documentary is here to correct that, with Liza getting to tell her story in her own words.

Rich with archival gems and Liza Minnelli's own point of view, Bruce David Klein's luminous documentary celebrates a young entertainer full of boundless raw talent and the deep, creative relationships with her mentors and influences.



Great Performances: Now Hear This

Fridays, April 11 to April 25 at 8:30pm

Travel with host, Mexico City Philharmonic chief conductor Scott Yoo, as he reveals the creative process behind a diverse range of classical music in both historic and modern-day periods.

April 11, Chopin's Polish Heart

Chopin was born in Poland and lived there until age 20, when war broke out. Seeking safety and inspiration, he found a new home in Paris... though he longed for his old one. Scott and Polish-Canadian pianist Jan Lisiecki explore the folk music of Poland and the Romantic-era artists and musicians of Paris, Chopin's diverging inspirations.

April 18, Boccherini: Night Music

The Spanish court brought Boccherini, Europe's greatest cellist, from Italy to Spain. There he created new musical forms and fell in love with his adopted hometown -- until he was exiled to the Sierra. He promptly wrote a love letter to his city, Night Music of the Streets of Madrid, which became his most popular composition. Scott and four great young players take an all night walking tour of Madrid's current night music, to better understand Boccherini's inspiration.

April 25, Rachmaninoff Reborn

Rachmaninoff was a Russian aristocrat who lost everything in the Bolshevik revolution: his home, his family fortune, his musical inspiration. Adrift in a new landscape, speaking little English, he longed for a homeland that had disappeared. So at 44, to support his family, he changed careers and charted a new path. He embraced modern technology, toured relentlessly, and reinvented himself as a modern American artist.



Changing Planet: Coral Special

Wed, April 23 at 10pm

Renowned conservationist Dr. M. Sanjayan travels to the Maldives and the Florida Keys for an in-depth look at coral reefs — a habitat under urgent threat from climate change — and the innovative techniques that could save them.

Globally, coral reefs are at a crisis point; warming seas have caused corals to bleach and die at an alarming rate. Five hundred million people worldwide rely on reefs for food and to protect coastlines from storms and rising sea levels. But without action, scientists predict that nearly all reefs could die off in the next few decades.

Sanjayan visits Laamu Atoll in the Maldives to take part in a first-time collaboration that could be the key to restoring reefs.

Professor Peter Harrison from Southern
Cross University in Australia has devised a fertility treatment to help corals reproduce more successfully: "coral IVF." Peter is now working with a scientist who hopes to enhance this process further.

At the University of Miami, Professor Andrew Baker is creating a hybrid reef — a concrete structure seeded with coral larvae that will grow into a vibrant coral layer. These ready-made reefs could soon provide a home for wildlife and protect coastlines everywhere from extreme weather.

"The problems that coral reefs face can seem insurmountable, but around the globe, the scientific community is working together and working fast to come up with novel and surprising techniques to give coral a lifeline," said Sanjayan. "These projects give me hope." NPT PASSPORT






Nashville: The 20th Century in Photographs March 11 at 8:30pm; March 17 at 10pm







SPOTLIGHT - DAVID CHAK

David Chak completed his Professional Affiliation with Nashville PBS through the Humphrey Fellowship Program at Vanderbilt University, where he studied STEM and media literacy education in the U.S. and explored the role of charter schools in driving educational innovation for underserved populations.

Building on Arus Academy's impact on over 120,000 students and 70,000 teachers, he sought to apply his fellowship experience to expand the organization's reach.

Originally from Malaysia, Mr. Chak is the Curriculum Director and co-founder of Arus Academy, a social enterprise dedicated to high-impact educational interventions that create systemic change. Previously, he taught in one of Malaysia's lowest-performing schools through the Teach for Malaysia program and has contributed as a columnist for Malaysia's largest Mandarin-language publication and as a textbook writer.

Carolyn Adkerson (CA): David, it's great to have you here. Let's start by learning a bit more about you. Can you tell me about your background and your connection to Nashville PBS?

David Chak (DC): Thanks, Carolyn. I'm originally from Malaysia, where I co-founded a social enterprise called Arus. We focused on education programs and media literacy, which feels a bit similar to the work of Nashville PBS. When I came to the U.S. last year through a Fulbright program, I was excited to explore how education programs operate here. That's how I connected with Nashville PBS.

I initially volunteered for "Be My Neighbor Day" at Centennial Park, which is where I met Sam and Shawn. Our conversations about media literacy sparked a collaboration, and by February, I officially joined Nashville PBS. It's been a full-circle experience for me. Growing up, I learned English by watching PBS programs like BARNEY and SESAME STREET. Now, I get to contribute to PBS content, creating resources that help others learn.

CA: That's an incredible journey. Could you share more about your work here at Nashville PBS?

DC: Absolutely. My main focus has been on media literacy. I've developed five lesson plans totaling over 100 pages to help teachers educate students about media bias, representation, and how to navigate misinformation. For instance, one activity involves students acting as journalists to understand how news is shaped and targeted.

I've also produced 15 media literacy videos that will air on Nashville PBS. These videos are designed to be engaging and educational, covering topics like avoiding online scams and promoting kindness on social media. We've piloted these resources in classrooms across Davidson County and trained teachers to use them effectively.

CA: Media literacy is so vital, especially today. Why is it such an important focus for you?



DC: Misinformation can have real consequences, from polarizing societies to endangering lives. During COVID, for instance, we saw how misinformation led people to harmful decisions. Media literacy empowers individuals to discern what's real and what's not. It's not just about critical thinking—it's also about being a good digital citizen.

CA: That's incredibly impactful. What's next for you as you complete your time here?

DC: I'm returning to Malaysia soon, where I'll apply the skills I've gained here to new projects, including education documentaries and programs funded by a \$200,000 grant. I'll also share the videos and lesson plans we developed at Nashville PBS with my team back home. As for Nashville PBS, I'm thrilled to see these resources expand through PBS Learning Media, benefiting more educators and students.

CA: What has stood out to you about your experience with Nashville PBS and the broader Nashville community?

DC: Everyone here has been so welcoming and collaborative. Working with the Nashville PBS production team, especially Shawn, has been a great learning experience. I'll miss the vibrant arts scene in Nashville, the beautiful nature, and, surprisingly, the ease of getting around compared to home.

CA: We'll certainly miss you too, David. Thank you for your contributions to Nashville PBS and for sharing your story.

DC: Thank you, Carolyn. It's been an honor to be part of this work and to give back in a meaningful way.
